7.	Brokenbury Andy Gunther		
	Brokenbury is the Cess pit at Churston. Where are these new houses/developments going to go as this is apparently full?	sc	

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The document Susie is referring to is in the Torbay Infrastructure Study (5.4 Physical Infrastructure – Water Infrastructure, pg. 30). Brokenbury sewage treatment works is not full but is beginning to approach its design capacity.  a large amount of the current flow to Brokenbury is due to surface water (arising from increased rainfall) being combined with sewage as the two are in a combined system. The Council is therefore seeking to remove current surface water flows from entering the system where it can (on a piecemeal basis through drainage engineering works) and also to limit any further flows arising from new development through the extensive use of Sustainable Drainage Systems (SuDS). SuDS are a way of significantly limiting the amount of rain water which enters the sewer system from a development site. Through a combination of the above (drainage engineering works on existing flows and SuDS on new development), capacity at Brokenbury is not seen to be a limiting factor to new development and growth. The use of SUDS was discussed within current and future developments, including what methods could be used (e.g. things like ponds, green roofs, trees, grassed areas, swales, etc.), the need for future development to think very carefully regarding surface water management and whether there would be the possibility for on-site solutions to foul drainage discharge through provision of reed beds, etc.	AGunth
Do you know which areas of the town's where this will be affected?  All the Sewers between Torquay and Paignton go to Brokenbury. In any new developments this will need to be taken into consideration.	PB SC
